MINUTES OF THE COMMON COUNCIL MEETING HELD VIA ZOOM ON TUESDAY, APRIL 20, 2021

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Neitzke at 7:00 p.m.

J. Public Hearings

1. Public Hearing on a Special Use Permit for Puff N Stuff, a proposed tobacco store to be located at 6009 W. Layton Ave., submitted by Mohammed Qetairi, d/b/a GNV, LLC. (Tax Key No. 618-9999-000) (PC-3/09/21 Kastner)

Public Hearing opened at 7:06 p.m.

Ms. Kristi Porter, Community Development Manager, presented the details of the proposal. Ms. Porter said that is the property on 60th and Layton. This property is zoned as a C-2 Community Commercial District. The applicant would like to open and occupy about 1,800 square feet for a tobacco store. The hours of operation would be 10:00 AM to 9:00 PM daily. The applicant expects to have 3 employees per shift and

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they would expect about 50-75 customers daily. The products that would be sold would be vape pens, vape juice, pipes, hookahs, tobacco, gift sets, and other smoking accessories. They would have an ID scanner to ensure patrons are 21 years or older. They indicated that they would have a multiple camera security system. As far as parking goes, the shopping center requires 32 spaces for all uses on site and there are 38 spaces provided.

When staff visited the site, they took note of conditions of property and made recommended site improvements to the Plan Commission. Those improvements should be made within one year. They include a damaged refuse enclosure to be repaired, a new board-on-board enclosure for the Subway dumpster, removal of rutted asphalt to be replaced with concrete, and the parking lot to be restriped and pot holes filled.

Ms. Porter continued that this application went before the Plan Commission in March. The Plan Commission unanimously recommended Common Council denial due to its proximity to the high school. To date, Ms. Porter has not received any letters of objection. Alderperson Collins asked about the store or business it would be replacing to which Ms. Porter said that the space was vacant.

At 7:11 p.m. Alderperson Bailey was present.

Mr. Mohammad Qetairi, the applicant, was present to speak. He said he is open to any required recommendations of the Common Council. That patrons must be 21 and no sales to under ages. He will not tolerate his employees selling his products to those underage. There are other tobacco licenses near the high school in addition to his business. He's managed a store like this before and has not had a problem with the police department.

Motion by Alderperson Kastner, seconded by Alderperson Collins to close the Public Hearing. Motion carried unanimously.

Alderperson Bailey is for the approval of business as the owner is going to run a good business.

Alderperson Kastner is in favor of denial for the same reasons that were brought up at Plan Commission : proximity to the high school, and another facility selling

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the same.

Aldersperson Collins asked if Meijer's sells tobacco. Mr. Mohammad said yes they sell tobacco and electronic pen cigarettes.

Motion by Aldersperson Kastner, seconded by Aldersperson Akers to deny. On a roll call vote, the motion was denied 4-1 with Aldersperson Bailey opposed. Those in favor of were Aldersperson Akers, Aldersperson Collins, Aldersperson Kastner, and Aldersperson Saryan.

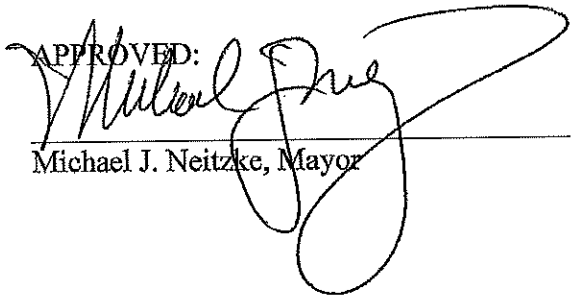

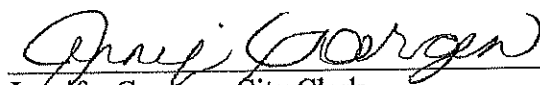
