4. Discussion and Decision related to keeping of animals in the City.

Discussion & Decision regarding keeping of Animals in the City

Mr. Rausch reviewed the number of animals allowed in different municipalities. He also shared additional comments provided by Karen Sparapani, Executive Director, Milwaukee Area Domestic Animal Control Commission (MADACC), following the last meeting. She suggests that the animal limit should be left where it is unless there is a plan to eliminate the Fancier Permit. Renewals for the Animal Fancier permits were recently mailed out. There are approximately 40 to 45 Animal Fanciers in Greenfield. Greenfield's current limit is four animals (combination of dogs and/or cats) with the Animal

Fancier permit; residents may have up to two animals without the permit.

A motion was made by Leon Saryan, seconded by Richard Dettman, to reaffirm via vote to maintain the status quo. The motion carried unanimously.

5. Discussion and Decision related to Milwaukee Area Domestic Animal Control Commission model ordinances

Mr. Rausch provided a draft to the board to review and discuss. The key additions that could be added from MADACC model language to Greenfield ordinances include definitions about collars, language related to restraints, leashes, and transportation. The draft identifies where this language may fit within the existing Chapter 12, and Darren would work further with the City Attorney to further revise edit.

A motion was made by Leon Saryan, seconded by Cindy Leranthy to forward the draft as presented to the City Attorney. The motion carried unanimously.

6. Discussion & Decision related to Radon Testing in Schools and Similar Facilities

Discussion & Decision related to Radon Testing in Schools & Facilities

January is National Radon Awareness Month. Radon is a big problem in the City of Greenfield. Mr. Rausch indicated that an article was published in the NOW recently regarding Radon issues and dangers. Last November, there was a news story on WISN 12 about Radon in schools. The story stated that there are no requirements for testing schools for Radon levels. Mr. Rausch followed up with the Southeast Wisconsin Radon Information Center and was provided with a document with the standards and protocol for testing of Radon in schools. Testing in schools would have to be done by an outside contractor with long term tests. The document recommends that every ground contact classroom be tested. Discussion ensued regarding sending educational information to not only schools but potentially daycares, and senior living facilities. Mr. Rausch said that this could be considered a yearly campaign to bring awareness of the dangers of Radon.

A motion was made by Pam Akers, seconded by Cindy Leranthy, to direct the Health Officer to send an informational letter to the School Superintendents of public and parochial schools as well as senior living facilities regarding the dangers of Radon and to consider the importance of Radon testing. The motion carried unanimously.
