

MINUTES OF THE COMMON COUNCIL MEETING HELD AT THE GREENFIELD CITY HALL ON TUESDAY, OCTOBER 4, 2022

A. Call to Order & Roll Call

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Neitzke at 7:00 PM.

Present: Alderpersons Denise Collins, Bruce Bailey, Karl Kastner, Shirley Saryan

Excused: Pamela Akers

Also present: Brian Sajdak, City Attorney; Jeff Katz, Director, Neighborhood Services; Jennifer Goergen, City Clerk; Kristi Porter, Community Development Manager.

B. Opening Prayer

An opening prayer was given by Chaplain Leggett.

C. Pledge of Allegiance

D. Approval of the September 20, 2022 Common Council minutes

Motion by Alderperson Kastner, seconded by Alderperson Collins to approve. Motion carried unanimously.

E. Mayor's Report

Mayor Neitzke spoke about the budget public hearing, which is scheduled for November 1, 2022, as long as it gets published by the Journal Sentinel properly.

F. Aldermanic Reports

G. Announcements

Mayor Neitzke went to agenda item H.

Mayor Neitzke spoke about the ribbon ceremony for the Powerline Trail is on October 5, 2022 at 5 PM on 94th Street. DPW Expo is on Thursday, October 6, 2022 at Konkel Park.

Alderperson Kastner said that Friends of Greenfield Police Department Information Meeting is on Thursday, October 13, 2022.

Alderperson Collins jumped to agenda item M.

H. Citizen Commentary

Mayor Neitzke said that Jeff Ubl, Mary Payne, and Pat LaSusa would speak under the public hearing item.

Jim Konkel, 4155 S. 99th St., spoke about the new bike trail's fence and his property, dog issues, and asked for signs or an extension of the fence. Jeff Katz, Director of Neighborhood Services, said that signs will be going up tomorrow. Mayor Neitzke said that if he doesn't hear back, he should give Alderperson Kastner or him a call. Mr. Konkel asked about a sign that said no air breaking since they are by the Hale Interchange. Mayor Neitzke said that there are signs going onto and coming off the freeway. Mayor Neitzke said that we have tried but the Sheriff's office has jurisdiction.

I. Public Hearings

1. Public Hearing on a Special Use Permit to establish a drinking place within The Woods – GreatLife Senior Community, to be located at 11800-02 W. Edgerton Ave., submitted by Greg Petruski, d/b/a GLPropCo-Greenfield, LLC. (Tax Key No. 611-8964-000) (PC-8/09/22 Kastner)

The public hearing was opened at 7:08 PM.

Kristi Porter, Community Development Manager, presented the zoning, a licensed bartender would be needed, site information, and recommendations from the Plan Commission. There weren't any

letters of objections or support received.

Mr. Greg Petruski, the applicant, spoke about amenities to be premier and upscale, residents want the amenity, traffic safety, and legislation.

Alderman Saryan asked about the gazebo terminology and Mr. Petruski explained that it is a different enclosed building, separate from the main building, because the law doesn't allow a dual business. He spoke about the residents wanting it so they didn't have to drive to a bar or drink and drive. There are three seats at the bar, and spoke about the building and the use of the patio.

Mayor Neitzke compared the size to that of a one-car garage, to which Mr. Petruski said that it's for the use of the residents and their families.

Mayor Neitzke introduced the following as speaking for informational purposes only:

Patrick LaSusa, 11750 W Edgerton Ave., spoke about insufficient notice, public drinking place terminology, and asked about the amount of alcohol licenses left.

Mayor Neitzke introduced the following as speaking against:

Jeff Ubl, 12042 W. Carpenter Ave., spoke about zoning, the neighborhood, property values, senior living facilities and liquor licenses, the public hearing notice and marketing materials received from The Woods, and is opposed to having a bar in the neighborhood.

Paul Stassi, 12120 W. Holmes Ave., spoke about being opposed to the extension of the bar to the patio, not getting a notice, the marketing notice from The Woods, drinking place terminology, permitted occupancy of the patio, noise and entertainment concerns, and how it affects the neighborhood.

Mary Payne, 11750 W. Edgerton Ave., spoke about their alderman, traffic, dust from the construction, and congestion.

Mayor Neitzke said that Doreen Ubl, 12042 W. Carpenter Ave., is registered against but not speaking.

Mr. Petruski spoke about their mailer, the cocktail lounge, other senior facilities, noise, working with the neighbors, average resident age, and the patio TV and speaker.

Mayor Neitzke asked about waiting to apply when the law changes. Mr. Petruski responded that they don't know when the law would change.

Alderman Saryan asked if the alcohol license is denied, could residents still bring their own alcohol, which was confirmed by Mr. Petruski.

Alderman Kastner said that the concept is for interaction, since the alcohol brings people out of their rooms, and he doesn't see a downside to this.

Mr. Petruski mentioned less driving, since they would have this amenity onsite, and happy hour is what is sought after by residents.

Mayor Neitzke asked about how many places have active Class B liquor licenses for those that Mr. Petruski had toured in Southeastern Wisconsin, to which Mr. Petruski responded that it is more than a couple and all the new senior communities want to obtain a liquor license or get the law changed.

Alderman Saryan asked how many liquor licenses are left. Jennifer Goergen, the City Clerk, responded that we are at our quota. We have 42 regular and 14 reserves left. All 42 are currently

spoken for and this would be one of them.

Mayor Neitzke confirmed that this would be our last regular liquor license and asked about leasing.

Mr. Petruski responded that it's going well and that there are four families moving from the nearby neighborhood without the bar option and spoke about surveys.

Ms. Porter explained the drinking place terminology and the Municipal Code. The building inspector would establish capacity limits at the time of inspections.

City Attorney, Brian Sajdak, explained the notice language and those that received the notice, notices classes, and when notices get sent out.

Mayor Neitzke explained the publication process, and spoke about the public hearing notice, the *Southwest Now*, and state statutes.

Mr. Ubl spoke about those that are hard of hearing and noise concerns, and bringing your own drinks.

Mr. Stassi expressed his concerns.

Mr. LaSusa asked about the drinking place terminology and Attorney Sajdak spoke about the Municipal Code and NAICS Code.

Mayor Neitzke introduced Dean Sievert, 3050 W. Kimberly Ave., registered as speaking for purposes only, spoke about property values, premier amenities, use of a licensed bartender, and that he is indifferent.

No one else spoke for or against it or for informational purposes.

Motion by Alderperson Bailey, seconded by Alderperson Kastner to close the public hearing at 8:06 PM. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Alderperson Kastner, seconded by Alderperson Bailey to approve agenda item I1a and I1b, with the Special Use Permit to be limited to the hours of operation and to the location as indicated in the Site and Architectural Plans as presented, which would be within that patio designated space, not the entire place.

Under discussion, Alderperson Bailey asked about the number of licenses, to which Mrs. Goergen clarified that all alcohol licenses are tracked, even bars that are closed down.

Mayor Neitzke spoke about the reserved licenses and fees, future developments that would like a liquor license, the size of the gazebo, senior centers, and leasing without the liquor license.

Mr. Petruski spoke about the legislation possibly changing.

Mayor Neitzke spoke about recouping costs if other senior facilities applied for a reserved license.

Attorney Sajdak talked about the change in the law, violating the law, the Department of Revenue, the Tavern League, reserved licenses and fees, and beer and wine licenses for restaurants.

Mayor Neitzke expanded upon restaurants wanting liquor licenses, and liquor licenses being a

big deal.

On a roll call vote, motion failed 2-2, with Alderperson Collins, Alderperson Saryan opposed. Those in favor were Alderperson Bailey and Alderperson Kastner.

Mayor Neitzke said that he is not voting or breaking the tie.

Alderperson Kastner and Mayor Neitzke asked Mr. Petruski if they wanted the tie to be broken so that building the gazebo could continue. Mr. Petruski stated that he would rather defer both agenda items.

Attorney Sajdak said to have one motion to reconsider and another motion for it to be placed on the next agenda.

Alderperson Saryan said that she would need to be presented with new information in between this meeting and then the next, in order to reconsider.

Alderperson Bailey commented about needing the full Council to consider the question with courtesy to Alderperson Akers, who was excused.

Mayor Neitzke explained that another notice would not be sent out and it would be more transparent for a motion to reconsider and placed on the next agenda to be made.

Attorney Sajdak explained the process of reconsideration.

Alderperson Collins said she is a no.

Alderperson Saryan and Mayor Neitzke spoke about when The Woods came to the Common Council two years ago seeking approval to develop that area.

Mr. Petruski said that they were not able to conduct the amenity survey two years ago.

Motion by Alderperson Saryan, seconded by Alderperson Kastner to reconsider agenda items I1a and I1b. Motion carried 3-1, with Alderperson Collins opposed. Those in favor were Alderperson Bailey, Alderperson Kastner, and Alderperson Saryan.

Motion by Alderperson Kastner, seconded by Alderperson Bailey to table agenda items I1a and I1b and place on the next agenda. On a roll call vote, motion carried 3-1, with Alderperson Collins opposed. Those in favor were Alderperson Bailey, Alderperson Kastner, and Alderperson Saryan.

PART III. All ordinances or parts of ordinances contravening the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

PART IV. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
