

MINUTES OF THE COMMON COUNCIL MEETING HELD AT THE GREENFIELD CITY HALL ON TUESDAY, OCTOBER 1, 2024

A. Call to Order & Roll Call

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Neitzke at 7:01 PM.

Present: Alderpersons Andrew Drzewiecki, Karl Kastner, Pamela Akers, Shirley Saryan, Bruce Bailey

Also present: Jeff Katz, Director, Neighborhood Services; Jennifer Goergen, City Clerk

B. Opening Prayer

An opening prayer was given by Chaplain Leggett.

C. Pledge of Allegiance

D. Approval of the September 17, 2024 Common Council minutes

Mayor Neitzke spoke about the reconsideration of the Kalibres item. He was the deciding vote against it.

Motion to extend the hours failed 3-2. It was Mayor Neitzke's intention to wait for Alderperson Drzewiecki to be present since it is in his district.

Motion to reconsider the item with regard to the denial of the Kalibres license by Mayor Neitzke, seconded by Alderperson Kastner. Motion carried 4-1, with Alderperson Akers opposed. Those in favor were Alderpersons Drzewiecki, Bailey, Kastner, and Saryan.

Mayor Neitzke said to place it on the next agenda, which would be October 15, 2024, as a separate item as it was under old business.

Alderperson Akers said that she's opposed to the reconsideration.

Mayor Neitzke said that he was unsure if Alderperson Drzewiecki could vote since he was excused. He will talk to the City Attorney if Alderperson Drzewiecki's affirmative vote will be valid because he wasn't at the meeting. There was a discussion on what the number of votes were if Alderperson Drzewiecki and Mayor Neitzke could vote.

The Milwaukee alderperson was present.

Mayor Neitzke said that the Kalibres items presented after the public hearing will be on the next agenda to be reconsidered by the Common Council now that the alderperson of the district is going to vote. It's not a public hearing, but there will be citizen commentary.

There was a discussion if the Kalibres items were placed back on this agenda, but they were not. Under the minutes is where an item can be reconsidered. There won't be another notice to the neighbors since it won't be a public hearing.

Mayor Neitzke summarized that the motion for reconsideration passed with a majority of the votes. On a roll call vote, motion carried 5-1, with Alderperson Akers opposed. Those in favor were Mayor Neitzke, Alderpersons Drzewiecki, Bailey, Kastner, and Saryan.

Motion by Alderperson Akers to approve the rest of the September 17, 2024 minutes, seconded by Alderperson Bailey to approve. Motion carried unanimously.

E. Mayor's Report

Mayor Neitzke gave an update on The Turf and said that it's not opened yet and it's an active construction site. There is a Save The Turf website that shows the daily progress of the construction. He stated that Loomis Road would be opening this Saturday.

He gave an update on the huge success of the Public Works Expo. Alderperson Akers said she appreciated her mail carrier since they had to walk the neighborhood to deliver the mail during the expo since they don't normally do that. The money that is received from the expo gets put in a fund for safety equipment

and training; it covers the expenses for the event; and it develops relationships with vendors.

The mayor went to agenda item F.

Mayor Neitzke recognized the efforts of our Police Department and our Fire Department with the tragic event that happened at 107th and Layton Ave., where a semi hit a disabled vehicle and knocked out power.

Mayor Neitzke went to agenda item G.

F. Aldermanic Reports

Aldersperson Bailey gave a Tree Commission update about the number of trees planted and the grant that was received. Aldersperson Bailey and Mayor Neitzke spoke about the leaf collection schedule and that they will be picked up until it snows. The same trucks that do leaf collection also do snow removal. It's a huge job to replace the summer equipment with winter equipment on the trucks. If there is a complaint, let the mayor know so he is aware.

Aldersperson Akers spoke about the Department of Transportation meeting about the sound barriers. We are getting some of what we wanted but not all of what was wanted. She is frustrated that both sides aren't getting done, but she was encouraged by some of the discussions, and they will keep pushing to have both sides done.

Mayor Neitzke said that he wanted to issue a formal apology to Senator Carpenter and that the mayor may have misspoke. Senator Carpenter has been instrumental in trying to get sound barriers. Mayor Neitzke thanked Representative Donovan for getting funding for the barriers even though he has been restricted out of that area. The DOT admits that barriers should be everywhere except where there's a yellow area and utility conflict on the map. The barriers are justified on every metric along the whole stretch.

Mayor Neitzke circled back to agenda item E.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 12.12 OF THE HEALTH & SANITATION CODE
OF THE CITY OF GREENFIELD RELATING TO
RECYCLING, YARD WASTE, REFUSE AND SOLID WASTE

The Common Council of the City of Greenfield do ordain as follows:

PART I. Section 12.12 is hereby amended as follows:

(27)(b) There is hereby levied and imposed a special charge for services rendered in the form of garbage, rubbish, yard wastes and recycling collection and disposal and other related programs as follows:

1. Individual Collection (non-dumpster)

\$ 69.79 per annum per unit for recycling services

\$173.71 per annum per unit for garbage, refuse and yard waste services

\$243.50 per annum per unit for total special charge

PART II. The terms and provisions of this ordinance are severable. Should any term or provision of this ordinance be found to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining terms and provisions shall remain in full force and effect.
